

COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES – DISTINGUISHED SENIOR LECTURER

The College of Arts and Sciences Distinguished Senior Lecturer title was established in 2021 and exists on analogy with the Cooper Fellowship for tenured Professors. The award recognizes exceptional engagement with pedagogy and is an effort to reward some of our most valuable faculty. The requirements for eligibility and the process for nomination and selection are as follows:

- The College will appoint, through a nomination and review process, one A&S Distinguished Senior Lecturer annually.
- Those who have held the title of Senior Lecturer in the College of Arts and Sciences for at least four years are eligible to be nominated.
- The appointment comes with a one-time salary increase commensurate to other promotions and with a one-time one course teaching reduction.
- The appointment is for a one-year period.
- A&S Distinguished Senior Lecturers are expected to give a plenary presentation on their pedagogical interventions.
- Awardees retain the title following the year of the award, e.g., Jane Smith, Senior Lecturer, A&S Distinguished Senior Lecturer 2023-24.
- To assist in making these appointments, the Dean seeks nominations from departmental chairs or any regular (tenure and tenure-track) faculty member.
- The Senior Associate Dean in charge of this award is Jennifer Ferriss-Hill, Senior Associate Dean for Faculty Affairs and College Diversity.
